Through the Eyes of a Frontline Caregiver

Jen's story

Jen has been with our HSHS hospitals as a radiologic technologist for the past 18 years.

Jen is among the thousands of HSHS caregivers whose daily life has been uprooted by COVID-19. As a radiologic technologist, it is her job to scan chest x-rays for patients suspected of the virus.

She is also a hard-working wife and devoted mom to: Madeline (6-years-old) and Everett (3-years-old).

Jen recently shared with us her experiences as a frontline caregiver.

• "Every day before leaving work, I change out of my scrubs and into a regular set of clothes," says Jen.

• What should be a relaxing drive home, is instead filled with worry and fear. Jen no longer walks freely into the comfort of her home to greet her family.

• "I get home and am greeted by my husband and kids but before I can even hug them, I shower and change into a new set of clothes. I stress over getting sick or worse, getting my family sick," says Jen.

• **Fear of bringing the virus home and infecting loved ones, shortage of protective supplies and change in work schedules are all concerns our caregivers face. Yet, these fears don't stop people like Jen from showing up day after day, to provide high-quality Franciscan health care for our patients.**

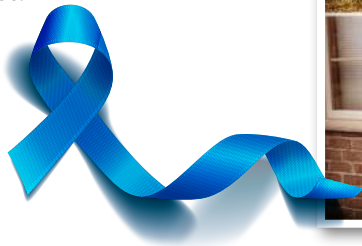

New crisis response fund established for HSHS caregivers

Opportunity to show your support

Everyone's lives have changed considerably as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. We know that everyone has had to make sacrifices. Please know that we continue to hold you and your family in prayer daily.

We also realize that the pandemic has caused unusual financial stress for some of our colleagues who may be struggling to cover basic expenses. A Colleague Emergency Assistance Fund has been established by the Hospital Sisters of St. Francis Foundation to support health care workers basic needs.

The fund provides emergency financial assistance for HSHS colleagues who face unusual and severe financial strain during the pandemic. Through this program, colleagues who apply may receive a \$50 food and/or one \$25 gas card per application, per week during the pandemic.

To date, more than 240 colleagues have required aid.

Are you curious what's happening with our fundraising campaign? Well, let's give you a quick update.

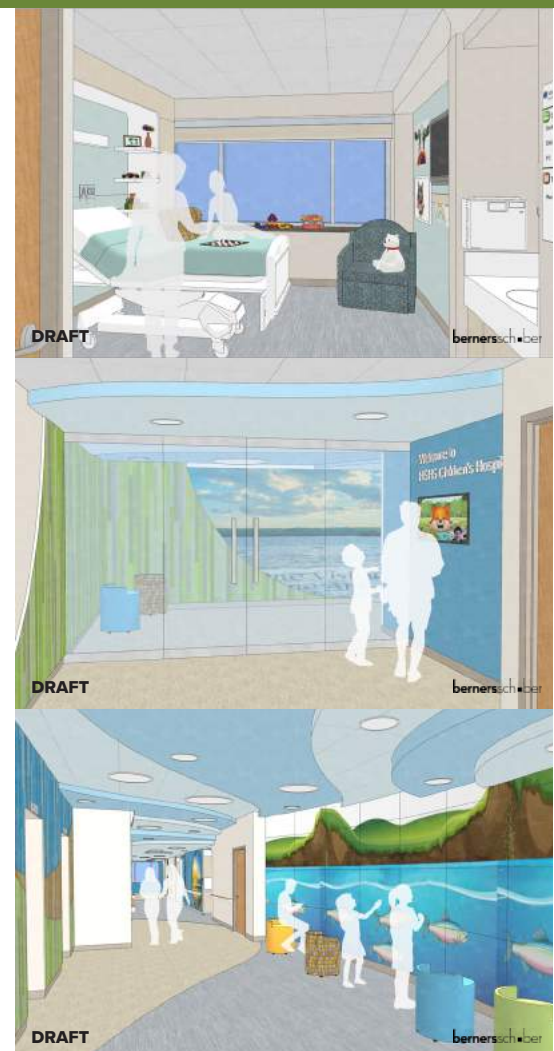
What's New?
