Re: Modifications to the Dual-Sign Medication List

HSHS has identified an opportunity to conserve the use of PPE by streamlining the medications requiring dual-sign off in the eMAR.

This will go live on Thursday, May 7.

The following list of medications will require a dual-sign off:

1. Alteplase (excluding catheter clearance)
2. Chemotherapy injections
3. Direct Thrombin Inhibitors – Intravenous Only
4. Epidural Opioids
5. Heparin Continuous Infusions
6. Hyperconcentrated (> 0.9%) Sodium Chloride Infusions
7. Insulin Regular – IV Continuous Infusions and Subcutaneous Concentrated (U500)
8. Intrathecal Medications
9. PCA Opioids
10. Schedule II Parenteral Narcotics (Continuous Infusions)
11. Adult Total Parenteral Nutritions (TPNs) (excluding isolation patients)
12. Pediatric/NICU TPNs
13. Paralytics
14. Magnesium sulfate infusions (Obstetrics only)
