Inspiring Teens toward Nursing Careers

Fall 2022-2023 @ St. John's College of Nursing

Do you know a Springfield-area high school or junior high student who dreams of becoming a nurse? The Nursing Pipeline Preparatory Program, or NP³, gives young people a head start into nursing careers and provides them with early mentors within the Springfield nursing community. The after-school program is sponsored by St. John's Hospital, The City of Springfield, Sangamon County Administration, and the Sangamon County Community Foundation.

Students enter NP³ when they are high school freshmen and continue through their senior year. This four-year experience familiarizes them with nursing school coursework, undergraduate college and nursing school admissions processes, test-taking skills, critical thinking and specialty training. The curriculum, developed by faculty and staff from St. John's College of Nursing includes:

- special lectures
- physical skills-training
- job shadowing
- problem-based learning (PBL)
- laboratory aptitude in the state of the art simulation center
- research
- college-planning seminars- financial aid planning
- supplemental instruction in college-level science, technology, engineering and math courses
- mentoring activities modeled after nursing education programs

Nursing Faculty, Family Nurse Practitioners, Nurse Administrators, and Professional Staff lead the after- school sessions.

The Pipeline is open to Springfield High schools (Lanphier, Southeast, Springfield High), Sacred Heart Griffin, Calvary and Lutheran High Schools. In addition, the program is expanding to include any interested high school in Springfield and surrounding high schools within Sangamon County. Participating students are chosen through a competitive process by a committee that includes St. John's Hospital and College professionals and District 186 partners, as well as community representatives. Applications must reflect high academic performance and attendance, a high level of motivation and sincere interest in becoming a nurse. The committee

also gives consideration to students with a disadvantaged socioeconomic background or the potential to become a first-generation college graduate.

Nursing Pipeline Preparatory Program (NP³)

High school freshmen interested in a career as a nurse are invited to the Nursing Pipeline NP³ places high school students alongside medical students and other professionals for a rigorous curriculum. The program introduces them to the field of nursing and exposes them to dozens of nursing career possibilities.

NP³ recruits a diverse group of students who want to become nurses and provides support, leadership opportunities, and a variety of hands-on experiences to assist them in pursuing this career goal. This four-year after-school program features two, 2-week modules of study during the academic year, as well as volunteer summer experiences. NP³ students are expected to remain in the program through all of their high school education.

The selection process for NP³ begins by submitting an application packet. Only incoming high school freshmen are eligible. The application must include evidence of high academic performance (GPA at least 2.5) and an attendance rate of at least 90%. The selection committee looks favorably upon applicants from underrepresented groups (African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans, Alaskan Natives and Pacific Islanders), as well as potential first generation college students and those who might not otherwise be able to get exposure to such nursing experiences.

Additional facts about the program

- A program director monitors participants' grades, attendance, and behavior in high school, as well as during NP3 activities.
- Students must maintain at least a 2.5 GPA in high school to remain in NP3.
- All students must be enrolled in a rigorous high school curriculum. Disciplinary problems, attendance issues, or other matters that impact a student's success in the program will be reviewed by NP3 administrators.

1. **Three letters of recommendation**: teacher, school administrator and community member preferred. Forms are attached.

2. **Personal essay** explaining interest in NP³, career plans, and other goals. Essay should be typed, double-spaced and not more than 250 words.

3. A summary of student experiences (form attached)
