# Chancellor's Message

Hello alumni!

It's time to celebrate again as we look forward to the alumni banquet on Saturday, Oct. 1, after two years of waiting due to COVID-19. I am looking forward to celebrating three 50-year classes, 1970, 1971 and 1972, and I know all alumni of these classes are, too.

Distinguished Alumna 2020 Dr. H. Catherine Miller, class of 70; Distinguished Alumna 2021 Dr. Jill Engel, class of 85; and Distinguished Alumna 2022 Beverly (Bev) Deaton, class of 63, will be honored. Young Alumna 2021 Amanda Clouser and Young Alumnus 2022 David Johnson, both from the class of 2015, will be celebrated, as well.

This spring, 34 students graduated with Bachelor of Science in nursing (BSN) degrees and three with master's degrees. Our new recruiter is making a difference by increasing enrollment numbers across all programs. Additionally, we now offer fall and spring admissions. This primarily is due to the new LPN-BSN pathway

program, which is the first and only program of its kind in Illinois. The LPN-BSN pathway streamlines how licensed practical nurses (LPNs) can advance their degrees in Illinois. Barriers to advancement have been removed, a transition course has been added and credit for prior learning is accepted. Relationships with Capital Area School of Practical Nursing (Springfield) and community colleges with LPN programs have resulted in the popularity of the pathway program.

Fifteen students are enrolled in St. John's College program at Greenville University as freshmen and will take their first nursing courses in spring 2024. Our faculty is embarking on the journey of curricular revision and plans to complete this mission by fall 2024.

We also have students enrolled in either the BSN-DNP or master's entry pathway who can work toward Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) degrees from St. John's College. It is exciting and humbling to reflect on the Sisters' progressive and persistent nature when they started the school of nursing in 1886. To this day, their mission and traditions of nursing education provide guidance to our administration and faculty and allow for additional program development, continued accreditation and well-prepared registered nurses. The advanced degrees allow St. John's College nurses to become faculty, achieve leadership opportunities, implement best practices research and prepare for specialty practice in their areas of interest.

In June, one of our alumni who specialized and practiced as a nurse anesthetist, Patricia Ann Sur Hart, '55, was recognized. Pat designated St. John's College to receive a substantial award of \$1.125 million, plus another \$125,000, for nursing student scholarships. Her family was adamant that one student be given the gift of full tuition for his or her senior year. Senior student Raven Smith, class of 2023, was chosen for the first Patricia Sur Hart Award.

Sadly, Pat passed in October 2021 at the age of 87, but I had the pleasure of learning from her family what St. John's School of Nursing meant to her and how much she cherished receiving ECHO. There was a time when Pat was not receiving ECHO. A member of Pat's family, Paul Esker, class of 1966, and his wife, Emma, made me aware of this issue, and I contacted them to clarify Pat's address so she didn't miss another issue. I never dreamed how that follow-up phone call would result in such happiness to Pat and a donation of this magnitude.

I am happy to share that the HSHS St. John's Hospital Foundation has hired a new colleague who will be responsible for engaging with alumni and assisting with details for the alumni banquet and ECHO. The colleague's name is Natalie Donaldson. Natalie's mother, Janet Hornickel Donaldson, is an alumna of the class of 1976.

# Legacy donor of \$1.125 million gift honored

St. John's College of Nursing honored and remembered the late Patricia Ann Sur Hart who endowed \$1.125 million to the college to establish a scholarship fund. The first scholarship recipient of the newly established endowment is Raven Smith of Springfield, Ill., a senior at St. John's College working toward her Bachelor of Science in nursing.

Patricia Ann Sur Hart (1934-2021) was born and raised in Effingham, Ill. She was a 1955 graduate of St. John's Hospital School of Nursing. After working in Denver as a registered nurse for two years, she returned to Springfield and continued her education at St. John's Hospital School of Anesthesia. She then entered the workforce as a certified registered nurse anesthetist.

In 1970, Pat moved to Lexington, Ky., and began working at Good Samaritan Hospital. Pat married Emette Hart in 1972, and they enjoyed many years together, traveling extensively. She enjoyed golfing, sewing, political conversations and reading, and was an avid University of Kentucky basketball fan.

Pat was aware of the sacrifices her parents made to send their three children to college. That surely was a factor in Pat donating one of the largest single gifts to St. John's College of Nursing to be used for endowed scholarships. She carried a quiet love for the college since her graduation and loved reading the ECHO with updates about her classmates and the school's advancements.

"Pat valued her education and with this endowment, she has now created educational opportunities for others," said Charlene Aaron, PhD, RN, chancellor of St. John's College. "We could not be more grateful for Pat's generosity toward the future of nursing."

"St. John's College of Nursing is more than just a place to go to get a degree," said Mark Sur, Patricia's brother. "It's a place where lives are transformed, and in Pat's case, a place to transform the lives of so many with her generous gift."



#### Distinguished Alumna 2020 Dr. H. Catherine Miller

Class of 1970

Catherine served as the assistant director of St. John's Hospital School of Nursing from 1988 - 1990. Catherine emulates all the characteristics we hold dear when you look at the St. John's nursing pin and excellence in all aspects of nursing. She has worked diligently throughout her career as a steward of quality nursing practice.

A lifelong learner, Catherine continues to develop by attending current conferences presenting on varied topics that enhance excellence in nursing practice. Catherine has helped many communities through presentations and consulting.

As a faculty member, Catherine was committed to teaching excellence in nursing through research-base theory and interventions. She always emphasized a caring approach that treated the patient as whole, with mind, body and spiritual needs.

### Distinguished Alumna 2021 Dr. Jill Engel

Class of 1985

Jill serves as the associate vice president for heart services for nursing, operations and patient care services and interim vice president and service line executive of heart and vascular services for Duke University Health System. In addition to her leadership roles, Jill has maintained her bedside practice as an acute care nurse practitioner (ACNP) in the cardiothoracic intensive care unit at Duke University Hospital, where she staffs per diem.

Jill serves as a reviewer for The Journal of Nurse Practitioners and has published and presented nationally and internationally on a variety of clinical, operational and leadership topics. She is a member of the American Association of Critical Care Nurses, American Association of Nurse Practitioners, Sigma Theta Tau, the American College of Cardiology and the Society of Thoracic Surgeons, where she serves on the multidisciplinary membership committee. She is certified as an ANCP, family and adult specialties and maintains her critical care RN (CCRN) and CCRN cardiac surgery specialist certifications, as well as her nurse executive advanced certification. Dr. Engel was inducted as a fellow into the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners in 2011 and completed the GE Health Management Academy Nurse Executive Fellows Program in 2018.

Jill lives in Morrisville. NC. with her husband. Samuel.

## Distinguished Alumna 2022 **Beverly (Bev) Kirby Deaton**

Class of 1963

Bev spent most of her professional life at St. Francis Hospital in Litchfield, Ill. She held multiple positions from staff nurse to chief nursing officer.

She was an early champion of RN-BSN and MSN programs. Obtaining her BSN from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville (SIU-E) in 1986 and her MSN from SIU-E in 1995. Throughout her career, Bev was a mentor to others, encouraging them with formal education, as well as the pursuit of specialty certifications.

Bev promoted education for nurses and physicians alike. As a member of NAACOG and then AWHONN, she was an instructor, as well as instructor trainer, for electronic fetal monitoring. She also taught neonatal resuscitation, childbirth preparation and lactation courses. Because of her expertise, Bev also had the opportunity to serve as an expert witness in malpractice cases, assisting in the defense of claims against nurses.

When the federal government introduced the Critical Access Hospital initiative, she worked with the St. Francis Hospital Board of Directors to apply for and gain this designation. This provides reimbursement for Medicare dollars at an increased rate, assisting rural hospitals to remain open and able to care for the citizens of their communities.

Bev officially retired from nursing in 2011.
