

Professional Licensure Disclosure

1. Licensure and Certification Determinations. To prospective students, any determination by the institution that the program does not meet licensure or certification requirements in the state in which the student is located. Similarly, the school must make a direct disclosure to any prospective student located in a state where the institution has not made a determination regarding whether the program meets state licensure requirements. If this is the case, any student who receives the notice and subsequently enrolls must provide acknowledgement to the institution that he or she received the disclosure.
2. Licensure and Certification Changes. To prospective and enrolled students, any determination by the institution that the program ceases to meet the state educational requirements for licensure or certification in the state in which the student is located, within 14 calendar days of that determination.
3. Notice of New Adverse Actions. To prospective and enrolled students, any adverse action initiated by a state or accrediting agency related to programs offered by the institution solely through distance education or correspondence within 30 days of the institution becoming aware of the action.
