



Coming Together to Help Those in Need

In one weekend, you clothed 2,000 refugees



The words “thank you” are not enough to express the awesome gratitude we feel for our community. Over the course of one weekend in late August, a clothing drive for Afghan refugees went from being an idea between two HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital colleagues to a U-Haul crossing the state.

Radiologist Dr. Meghan Hanson and Manager of Imaging John Wittstock organized the donation drive after discovering they both wanted to do something to help the people arriving at Fort McCoy. They sent a few emails to friends and family and it took off from there. Hundreds of individuals and organizations such as Big Brothers Big Sisters, Love INC, Sheboygan Christian School, Mama Bear & Co. and Shepard’s Closet and Food Pantry all pitched in.

“It was such a privilege to be the collection point for this generous act of compassion,” shared Johannah Wenig, HSHS St. Nicholas Foundation Director, “These refugees are scared, fleeing their homes, and leaving everything behind. Our community stepped in to help.”

Altogether the donations almost filled a 26’ U-Haul and clothed about 2,000 people, or a quarter of the Afghan refugees at Fort McCoy.
