Balancing school and work are a struggle for most looking to continue their education while providing expert care for patients at the hospital. Receiving a scholarship is a huge sense of relief. Saving Lives Through Compassionate Care

Your support allowed John to receive the care needed to save his life

As a standard pre-surgery precaution, John paused his blood thinning medication in preparation for a surgery procedure on his back. Unfortunately, a day before his surgery was scheduled to happen, he realized he was having a stroke and rushed to the Emergency Room at HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital. When a patient is exhibiting signs and symptoms of a stroke, our caregivers know that every second counts. "I was treated like I was the only one in the hospital", John shared. He was amazed at the service he was getting as his caregivers acted quickly, decisively and as a coordinated force to quickly address John's crisis.

John received immediate care for his stroke. He was monitored closely during his stay for internal bleeding as the staff worked to adjust his blood thinning medication and get him back to full health. Despite having to be woken up every 30 minutes during his first night stay, John knew that they were taking every precaution to ensure his safety; "Everyone was so professional and kind". As John reflected on his experience, he shared, "I don't know if that type of treatment and care is available everywhere, but I don't think so. I was in awe of the service I was getting".

John credits the staff at HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital for saving his life.

"They allowed me to continue on with my life as I had enjoyed it. I appreciate everything they did for me".

Specialized Cancer Care at HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital

Your support helps patients in our community

HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital strives to provide the latest treatments, technology and equipment needed to care for patients seeking cancer care. Previously, our teams at HSHS St. Vincent Hospital Cancer Centers at St. Nicholas Hospital had limited ability to provide care to head and neck cancer patients due to ongoing surveillance needs, requiring complex equipment.

According to the American Cancer Society Cancer Statistics Center, the projected incidence rate of oral cavity, pharynx and larynx cancer combined in the United States is 15% per 100,000. In Wisconsin, our combined incidence rate is 15.7%, with a projection of 1,310 new cases in 2022.



Because of **YOUR** support, head and neck cancer patients have a place to seek care, right here at the HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital. Four new pieces of equipment have been purchased to allow physicians and caregivers the ability to bring this care to patients in need.

This allows providers at the HSHS St. Vincent Hospital Cancer Centers, located at HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital, to keep the patients right here in Sheboygan.

"We have been successful in expansion of our radiation oncology providers and services here at HSHS St. Nicholas Hospital," said Megan Pfarr, Interim Director of Oncology Operations, HSHS St. Vincent Hospital Cancer Centers.
