

"I'm so grateful for the outreach and everything everyone has done," exclaimed Jamie.

"Nurse's Nook helped 'provide padding' when money got tight. It was a huge blessing," said Jamie. The sisters received essential need items like towels, toothbrushes and other general hygiene and cleaning products that they might otherwise not be able to afford on their budget.

The holidays came around and Jamie did everything she could to ensure that Sarah would have a traditional, joy-filled holiday. "Without Nurse's Nook, Christmas would have been way more stressful," said Jamie. The Adopt-a-Family program assisted Jamie with Christmas gifts like winter coats, boots, gloves, and other items to make an Oconto winter more bearable.

Nurse's Nook stepped in again by providing holiday meals for the sisters to ensure they could celebrate with happiness. "With everything we have been through, it was nice to give Sarah the full holiday experience. She did not have to worry about a thing," added Jamie.

Continues to Help Kids in Need

You keep kids happy, healthy and in school

Did you know that 16% of Oconto County school children are living at or below the federal poverty line and 49% are enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program?

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, health and education are closely linked. When a child's basic nutrition and fitness needs are not met, they are less likely to be successful in school. That's where you come in!

Through Nurse's Nook, a program of HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital, donors like you are helping fulfill the unmet needs of children and teens in our communities.

You do this in three ways:

- Providing basic need items (hygiene products, clothing, food and winter gear)
- Improving access to medical equipment (blood glucose meters, crutches, inhalers, etc.)
- Addressing mental health challenges (providing coping tools that help reduce anxiety)

Nurse's Nook assists students in eight school districts in our area plus two private schools.



On average, the program is used about 750 times every week. All items are given out free of charge and with confidentiality in mind. There are no income restrictions. Instead, school nurses, guidance counselors, and support staff work as a team to identify students in need. A collaborative effort helps make sure no child slips through the cracks.

With your help, Nurse's Nook also recently expanded mental health support for students in some of our Oconto County schools. In collaboration with the schools and a local mental health agency, Nurse's Nook is providing financial support for students and families to meet with a mental health provider at school. By removing these barriers to care, you are breaking the stigma of mental health and giving these students and families a safe and welcoming environment to ask for help.

ExpandingMental Health First Aid

How you are teaching teens to help their friends in crisis

It is no secret that access to services for mental health and substance use disorders is a growing need in our country. In 2020, a community needs assessment confirmed that these were also two of the top health related issues facing the Oconto County community. Since then, HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital has been working with a consortium of local mental health and substance use organizations, known as the NEW Hope Coalition, to address these needs.

Through Adult and Youth Mental Health First Aid trainings, the coalition has been training adults to recognize the signs of mental health or substance use disorder in adults and youth (ages 12+). Participants learn how to offer and provide initial help and guide an individual to the appropriate professionals.

This knowledge takes fear and hesitation out of conversations about mental health and substance use. Instead, participants have an action plan that allows them to respond safely and responsibly to someone facing these challenges. To date, these programs have trained more than 1,000 people locally!

With the generous support of donors like you, we were able to expand the program this year to include Teen Mental Health First Aid trainings – a first for our region! These courses prepare teens to respond when a friend is experiencing a mental health or substance use challenge or crisis. Last school year, we added six new certified instructors and trained more than 300 teenagers.
