No Clowning Around After many falls, Diane reclaimed her life

Diane, 76, of Green Bay, was enjoying an active retirement including volunteering, knitting and spreading joy as "TaaaDaa" the clown. Then in March 2019, she was walking to her car in a local furniture store parking lot when a gust of wind knocked her down.

"This was the fifth time I fell within a short period of time – only this time, I hit my head hard on the concrete curb," she said. Bystanders witnessed the fall and called for an ambulance.

Upon arrival at the hospital, vertigo set in. Diane recalled, "I was sensitive to everything – especially light and sound." While her past falls resulted in minor concussions, they resulted is one was much, much more severe.

Diane was referred to a number of different multidisciplinary teams including her primary care, sports medicine and neurology in the months that followed.

Reminiscing about the care received, Diane explained, "You have all the resources I needed, right here within HSHS."

From physical therapy to speech and language, Diane was on the road to recovery. Her care team helped her sharpen her balance and overcome the vertigo. She also found healing through the hospital's concussion support group.



"The physical therapy team at HSHS St. Mary's Hospital was wonderful. They all showed me true compassion," shared Diane.

Diane eased back into her many hobbies and is now

on a mission to knit 70 prayer shawls before Veteran's Day. But that's not all, when the COVID precautions lift, Diane, dressed as new clown character, "Wrinklezz," aspires to bring cheer to local assisted living facilities.

Diane credits the care team at HSHS for helping her reclaim her life. "The progress I've made is very encouraging," she said.

Update on Join the Fight campaign

In the midst of caution for the coronavirus, there is an equal amount of excitement brewing for HSHS St. Vincent Children's Hospital. As you may recall, the goal of our Join the Fight campaign was to create a "hospital within a hospital" with modernized spaces and designs created especially for children and the unique care they require. The areas to be transformed were in the emergency department and on the tenth floor.

Our campaign to raise \$10 million, although ambitious at the time, was the single largest campaign in the history of our hospitals. Today, we are thrilled to tell you that, together, we've reached our goal! Thank you!

A total of 2,783 donors, including friends, colleagues, corporations, foundations, and even kids themselves, poured in from every corner of Northeast Wisconsin and beyond. Of those supporters, more than 1,238 were brand new donors. Wow!

Construction continues to occur on tenth floor. The designs for the pediatric and pediatric intensive care unit are joyful, colorful and familiar. Highlights for this renovation include:

A reconfigured tenth floor that is devoted to children's health.

Comfortable spaces so parents can remain with their kids - including a dedicated laundry room, breastfeeding room, and respite area.

Kid-friendly patient rooms equipped with color changing lights, private bathrooms, and seizure monitoring equipment!

A **lounge where teens can "escape"** from the rigors of treatment.

An **expanded Pediatric Intensive Care Unit** with increased capability to care for critically ill children.

Newly **added isolation rooms for kids** with highly contagious diseases like COVID-19.

HSHS St. Vincent Children's Hospital is Green Bay's first and only children's hospital. With every detail tailored to kids, HSHS St. Vincent Children's Hospital delivers exceptional health care to children while making them feel comfortable and supported, close to home.
