Almost Home

YOUR SUPPORT ALLOWS PATIENTS MORE TIME FOR REHABILITATION

Last summer, Kristin Bates of Daggett, Michigan. was preparing to leave to see her endocrinologist in Oconto Falls, when she fell in her yard. The loud crack made her think she had broken her ankle, but she didn't want to miss her appointment, so she got in the car and headed to Oconto Falls.

Once she made it to her appointment and told her endocrinologist what had happened, she was advised to visit the HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital Emergency Room (ER). The caregivers at the ER confirmed Kristin fractured her ankle and completely knocked the

long bone out. She had major surgery to fix and reset these bones.

Kristin started occupational and physical therapy while recovering in the hospital, but she knew she wouldn't be able to go straight home. She needed more rehab before she could return to living alone but was worried about going to a traditional rehab facility. Kristen was worried that environment might have higher rates of COVID-19.

She was so grateful to learn about the Almost Home Swing Bed Program at

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HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital. This is an option for patients who cannot go home yet, but do not need the higher level of care a hospital brings. It gives patients the space and assistance needed to recover in a home-like setting.

During her time in the Swing Bed Program, Kristin continued working with physical and occupational therapists who helped her strengthen her ankle after the surgery. "They worked hard with me every day I was there," said Kristin. After a month and a half, her caregivers noticed she had improved her strength enough to go home and get back to her normal routine.

"They worked so hard to help me get home, even helped arrange transportation. They were willing to do anything to get me back to the comforts of my own home," Kristin said while reflecting back on her experience. She recalls all the hospital employees being so positive.

"It was a really good experience. I saw they were dedicated to their patients. I felt that they cared about me; I wasn't just ANOTHER patient in ANOTHER bed," said Kristin. Because of **YOUR** support, patients at HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital have a comfortable environment to heal and build the strength they need to go home safely.



YOUR Support Brings NEW Equipment to HSHS St. Clare Laboratory

Over time, HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital saw an increase in patients needing platelet transfusions. Platelets are commonly transfused in patients who are at an increased risk of dangerous bleeding; have a low platelet count; or have platelet dysfunction due to trauma, surgery, cancer treatments (chemotherapy, total body radiation, or targeted therapies); or decreased bone marrow production of platelets.

The goal of a platelet transfusion is to stop or prevent bleeding in those patients. However, the laboratory team at

HSHS St. Clare Memorial Hospital needed a new platelet agitator to keep up with the volume. Because of your support, the tumbler platelet agitator that had been used for over 30 years was replaced with a new flatbed platelet agitator with an incubator, to ensure that patients are transfused with quality and effective platelets.
