FROM MICHIGAN'S HUNTING TRAILS TO HSHS ST. VINCENT HOSPITAL – HOW YOU SAVED ONE HUNTER'S LIFE

In October 2023, Scott Ladner traveled from his home in Conneaut Lake, Pennsylvania to the Upper Peninsula (U.P.) of Michigan for his annual hunting trip. What unfolded was a life-altering experience that taught him the importance of paying attention to his heart health.

Scott set out from their cabin near Iron Mountain, Michigan. He was ready for a full day of hunting with his son and two friends. The day began like any other – breakfast, camaraderie, and the anticipation of a successful hunt. Accompanied by his loyal black lab, Minnie, Scott headed into the woods. Little did he know that this day would take an unexpected turn. As he hiked through the hunting trails, Scott was overcome by the urge to rest. Determined to make the most of their hunting trip, he pressed on. He clung to trees for support, struggling for over an hour. "I finally came out into a field where I could see our truck parked. I had to stop every 50 feet to make it back," recalls Scott. It was clear that something was wrong, and he decided to seek medical help.

The hunting party rushed Scott to the hospital 40 miles away and the medical team diagnosed his heart attack. He needed a cardiac catheterization as soon as possible, but they didn't have the ability

to perform the procedure there. He needed to be transferred to another hospital. Transport via an ambulance would have taken several hours; therefore, a medical transport via air to Green Bay was arranged. Scott arrived safely at HSHS St. Vincent Hospital where donors like you support the advanced heart care he desperately needed.

At HSHS St. Vincent Hospital, Scott noticed the genuine care and empathy from his medical team. Despite being in a scary situation, he felt a sense of familiarity and warmth. It was as if everyone knew him personally. "Looking back, I remember feeling calm– calmer than I would have expected. I was very comfortable with the people around me – they were all nice, helpful, empathetic, and concerned about my well-being and safety. Despite being nearly 650 miles from home, I knew that I was in good hands," recalls Scott.

Now, at 84 years old, Scott has adjusted his lifestyle to prioritize his heart health. He advocates for moderation in all things and maintains an active lifestyle on his 95acre property. "I read obituaries and see people younger than me dying. My dad lived to age 97, and my mom to age 94. I just knew that I had more life left to live."

Scott's journey is a powerful reminder of your impact. Because of donors like you, Scott received specialized cardiac care he couldn't
