In Six Months' Time!

Every November, Tony Mocarski goes to his garage and gathers the Christmas decorations to bring into the house. While walking through the garage in 2021, what had always been a simple task for him quickly became a life-threatening situation.

The next day he felt ill. "I didn't want to eat, I just wanted to stay in bed," said Tony. He also began having minor foot pain, but just attributed it to his arthritis. Later that day his wife noticed bloody footprints through their house. It was at that moment that Tony realized what had happened.

Tony had stepped on a furniture tack

while gathering his decorations in the garage. The tack went through his slipper and into his toe. "I am diabetic and have neuropathy, so I didn't feel the tack go into my foot," he said. After taking off his sock, they saw his skin was a reddish color, from his foot all the way up to his knee.

Shortly after calling 9-1-1 Tony was taken to another local medical center where they explained he had necrotizing fasciitis, a rare bacterial infection that spreads quickly in the body and can even be life threatening. They amputated his toes and a portion of his foot to stop the bacterial infection from spreading further.

Now, the healing process could begin, but six months went by, and the wound wasn't healing. Tony asked about hyperbaric treatments, but his doctor told him that was not an option and to continue with the wound vac. "It seemed like it was never ending; I was just not healing," he said. Another six months went by with no progress, and his doctor approached him about hyper baric treatments. Tony jumped at the chance to receive a new treatment regimen, and he was transferred to the HSHS St. Joseph's Center for Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine.

"St. Joseph's is where I wanted to go!" said Tony

When Tony arrived at HSHS St. Joseph's Center for Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine, he was amazed that they had a specialized department just for cases like his. "My caregivers on the first day were fantastic! It was like an army came in, cleaned out my foot and I knew I was where I was meant to be," said Tony.

In December of 2022 he started his hyperbaric treatments, doing 60 dives over the next six months to help heal his wounds. He spent an hour and a half, in the glass chamber every day, Monday through Friday. "The staff was so sweet. They were always by my side to talk if it got claustrophobic in there," added Tony, "It was an awesome experience." He completed his last dive the end of May 2023. Hyperbaric treatments help the lungs collect more oxygen, in turn getting more oxygen to the tissues that need it to heal and fight infections faster. Patients lie in a glass chamber filled with pressurized, 100% oxygenated air. This is called a "dive" and usually lasts one to two hours.

Tony waited more than 12 months for his foot to heal while seeking care at another medical facility before arriving at HSHS St. Joseph's Hospital. Six months after his hyperbaric treatments, his wound was fully healed thanks to the specialty treatments made possible by donors like you.

"The people at HSHS St. Joseph's Center for Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine are angels from heaven!" exclaimed Tony. "Dr. Emily Mason, her team, and the hyperbaric treatment is the reason I am healed."
